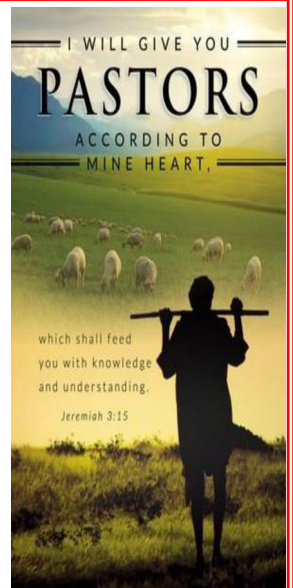

Catholic Education

The week of January 29 - February 4 is known as Catholic School Week. The Church in the US tries to promote Catholic education among the parishes and among the Catholic faithful. The sad reality is that many parishes in the US are closing their parochial schools due to a number of reasons: most notably, the lack of enrollment and finance. I always like a parish with a school. It is always nice to see the kids in uniforms marching to their classrooms and to church. But more importantly, it is good to instill in them a sense of reverence for our Catholic traditions. I am blessed to be at St. Barbara where we DO have a school. I have al-

ways been an ardent fan of Catholic education. In this Catholic School Week, I am calling all our parishioners to support *our school* in particular, and Catholic education as a whole in general.

While I myself never had a chance to attend any parochial school or any Catholic high school, my experience with Catholic education is not insignificant. Within my journey to the priesthood, I have had the opportunity to study at two Catholic institutions: the University of Dallas in Irving, Texas; and the University of Louvain (or Leuven, in Flemish) in Belgium—the latter of the two being the more important by far. Louvain, founded in 1425, is the *oldest existing* Catholic university in the world—medieval universities like Oxford, Bologna, and Salamanca were founded even earlier... but none is still Catholic now. Theologians from Louvain have contributed a great deal to the works of the Second Vatican Council (1962-65). The late American archbishop Fulton Sheen (d. 1979), also a graduate of Louvain, had stated that he was greatly indebted to this university. I am grateful to our former diocesan bishop Tod Brown for having given me the opportunity, back in 2004, to study theology either in Rome or Louvain. To this day, I am still thankful that I ended up in Louvain. Like Fulton Sheen, I will forever be indebted to this old university for the way I think as a Christian and the way I do/write theology.

Anyway, what does this background of mine have to do with Catholic School Week? I want parents to understand that a good Catholic education will shape the minds of children as they venture into the future. While the future is uncertain for everybody, we cannot underestimate the importance of a good Catholic foundation instilled in a child. At my former parish, St. Angela Merici in Brea, I once spoke with a school parent about this subject. I brought up the fact it is costly to send children to Catholic schools. She responded that people invest in many things: cars, homes, businesses, etc... so why not in their own children? I understand that while not every family can afford a Catholic education for their kids, and that public schools (which, by all means, are very *good*) can sometimes offer more in terms of resources—parents should do well to invest in their own children in the ways of faith. If you have already done so, we thank you: and keep it up. If you have not, it may be time to think about it. If you have thought about it but have not had a chance to look into the details, you can always contact us. I am asking and challenging Catholic parents to invest wisely: invest in your children. A good Catholic foundation is indeed indispensable for a child!

THE CHOSEN REMNANT

Zephaniah is one of the least-known of the Old Testament prophets. He speaks in today's first reading of impending judgment. But the Lord will leave a "remnant" in Israel. This image of a remnant, or remainder, was to become vital to both Judaism and Christianity.

Paul's letter to Corinth makes obvious his deep concern for the Christians there. They are too self-confident, he says, too sure of themselves. He admonishes them to remember that Christ has given them all they have.

Today's Gospel comprises the opening of Jesus' "Great Sermon." As God gave Moses the law on Sinai, so now Jesus gathers his disciples on a hillside to teach them the new law. Each of these Beatitudes contrasts the humiliation of the present with the glory of the future: poverty vs. the riches of God's kingdom, hunger for holiness vs. fulfillment in the Spirit, persecution vs. the reign of God. Jesus is here speaking to God's chosen "remnant."

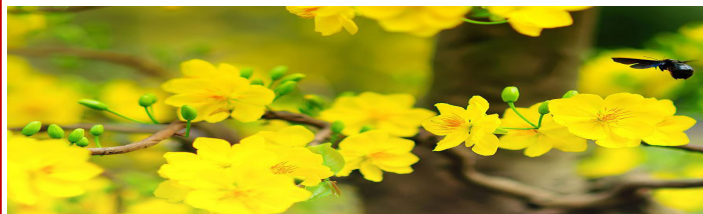

Tuần này, 29 tháng 1 đến 4 tháng 2, Giáo Hội Hoa Kỳ mời gọi các giáo xứ và các tín hữu ủng hộ cho nền giáo dục Công Giáo. Trong những năm vừa qua, rất là nhiều trường học tại các giáo xứ trong nước Mỹ đã phải đóng cửa vì thiếu học sinh và tài chánh. Là một linh mục, tôi rất thích giáo xứ có trường học. Tôi tin rằng khi các em còn trẻ, các em nên có một nền tảng vững chắc trong đức tin, để truyền thống giáo lý Công Giáo được thấm nhuần vào tâm hồn các em. Tôi rất vui mừng được phục vụ tại giáo xứ St. Barbara: nơi đây có trường học Công Giáo. Tôi luôn luôn ủng hộ nền giáo dục Công Giáo. Trong tuần này, các trường Công giáo mừng *Catholic School Week (Tuần Lễ của Giáo Dục Công giáo)*, tôi xin mời giáo dân Việt Nam cố gắng hết sức để ủng hộ trường học St. Barbara chúng ta nói riêng, và nền giáo dục Công Giáo nói chung.

Mặc dù tôi chưa từng có cơ hội đi học trường Công Giáo thời trung học hay tiểu học, nhưng kinh nghiệm của tôi về giáo dục Công Giáo không phải là không đáng kể. Trong cuộc hành trình đi tu làm linh mục, tôi đã được học tại hai trường đại học Công Giáo: University of Dallas (Texas) và University of Louvain (nước Bỉ). Tôi rất hân hạnh khi nói về Louvain, trường thành lập năm 1425. Đây là trường đại học Công Giáo cổ kính nhất thế giới: dĩ nhiên các trường trung cổ như Salamanca, Oxford và Bologna được thành lập sớm hơn nữa, nhưng các trường đó không còn là đại học Công Giáo nữa. Các nhà thần học từ Louvain đã đóng góp rất nhiều cho công trình của Công đồng Vaticanô II (1962-1965). Đức cố Tổng Giám Mục Fulton Sheen người Mỹ (mất năm 1979), một nhà thuyết giảng rất lỗi lạc, ngài cũng tốt nghiệp tại Louvain, đã tuyên bố rằng ngài rất mang ơn trường đại học này. Và chính tôi cũng rất biết ơn cựu Giám Mục Địa Phận Orange là Đức Cha Tod Brown: năm 2004, ngài đã cho tôi cơ hội chọn đi học thần học ở Châu Âu; Roma hoặc là Louvain. Tới ngày hôm nay tôi vẫn biết mình đã không lầm khi đi Louvain. Như cố Tổng Giám Mục Fulton Sheen, tôi luôn luôn biết ơn Louvain đã cho tôi một sự giáo dục Công Giáo vô giá trị.

Nói gì thì nói, chữ tiêu sử này của tôi có liên hệ gì đến tuần lễ của Giáo Dục Công Giáo? Tôi muốn các phụ huynh biết rằng một nền giáo dục Công Giáo tốt sẽ uốn nắn tâm trí các em trẻ. Chúng ta không thể coi thường một nền tảng Công Giáo mà chúng ta dành cho các em. Ở giáo xứ cũ của tôi, St. Angela Merici tại Brea, một lần tôi đã nói chuyện với một phụ huynh về việc đem con đến học trường Công giáo. Thực tế mà nói là rất tốn kém. Cô trả lời rằng: người ta đầu tư vào nhiều thứ: xe hơi, nhà cửa, cơ sở thương mại, vv ... vậy tại sao không đầu tư cho con cái mình? Tôi biết rằng không phải gia đình nào cũng có thể cho con cái đi học trường tư. Và tôi cũng biết rằng các trường công ngoài đời cũng rất tốt cho các em. Nhưng tôi cũng muốn kêu mời các cha mẹ cố gắng đầu tư về vấn đề thiêng liêng cho con cái mình. Tạ ơn Chúa vì Ngài đã cho các gia đình Việt Nam chúng ta cũng được khá giả. Vì vậy tôi xin các phụ huynh có con cái cũng đáp lại tình thương của Chúa bằng cách đầu tư vào đời sống đức tin của các em, và cung cấp cho các em một nền tảng Công Giáo vững chắc.

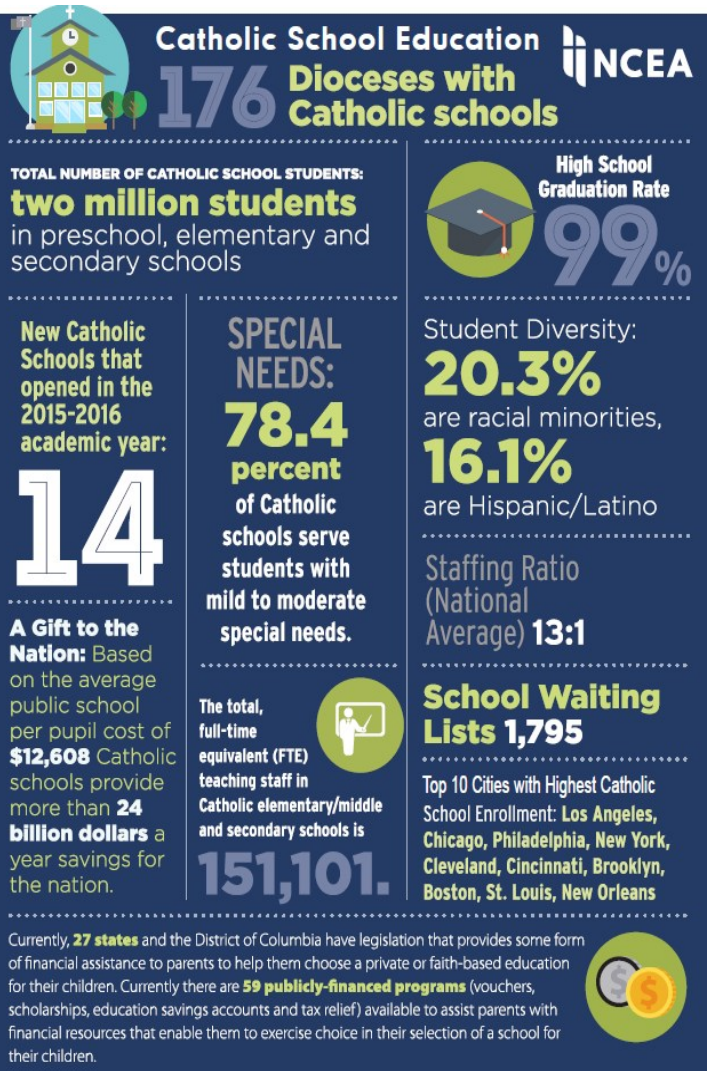

What is National Catholic Schools Week?

Since 1974, National Catholic Schools Week is the annual celebration of Catholic education in the United States. It starts the last Sunday in January and runs all week, which in 2017 is January 29 - February 4. The theme for the National Catholic Schools Week 2017 is “Catholic Schools: Communities of Faith, Knowledge and Service.” Schools typically observe the annual celebration week with Masses, open houses and other activities for students, families, parishioners and community members. Through these events, schools focus on the value Catholic education provides to young people and its contributions to our church, our communities and our nation.

Good News for the Nation: Catholic Schools Are Thriving

Catholic schools offer academic excellence and faith-filled education for students nationwide. National test scores, high school graduation rates, college attendance and other data show that Catholic schools frequently outperform schools in both the public and private sectors. While some Catholic schools are challenged by declining enrollments and school closures, the good news is that there is a strong demand and enthusiasm for Catholic schools. Nearly thirty percent of Catholic schools have waiting lists for admission and new schools are opening across the country. This infographic shares facts and figures about the ongoing excellence and promise of growth represented in our country's Catholic schools.
